The courses in the Calendar are categorised into 9 focus areas:

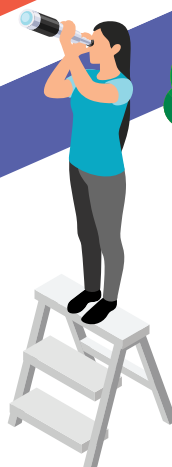

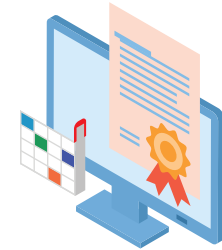

Follow these 3 steps to apply:



01 Browse

- Visit the SCP website: **www.scp.gov.sg**
 - Search and review course of interest.
 - Check eligibility requirements.
 - Note the course period and nomination deadline.*
- * Courses will be open for application and a General Information Brochure will also be conveyed to eligible countries, territories, intergovernmental organisations three to four months prior to the course start dates. Check the SCP website for the latest updates.



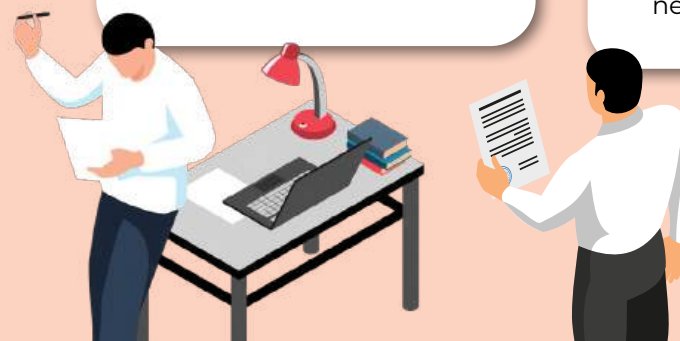

02 Apply

- Submit your application before the nomination deadline (2359hrs SGT of the stated date)*.
 - Follow instructions and upload required documents.**
 - Receive an email acknowledgement with a link to access your application for status updates after submission.
 - Application endorsements from your Supervisor and the National Focal Point for technical assistance are required through an email link sent to them.
- * Only completed applications received successfully before nomination deadline will be considered.
- ** Draft applications can be saved but will be deleted from the system after 3 working days.

03 Acceptance

- Successful applicants will receive a Conditional Letter of Acceptance via email.
- Confirm your place promptly by submitting requested documents (e.g., flight ticket and passport details).
- You will be assisted with application for Entry Visa into Singapore, where applicable. You will need to obtain the relevant transit visa for your travel, if required.
- Ensure that your passport or travel document is valid for at least six months from the date of your scheduled arrival in Singapore.
- Administrative details, including programme schedule, will be disseminated to confirmed participants nearer to course dates.

Resilient Urban Ecosystems for Adaptability



COURSE DATES:

6 - 10 APR 2026

NOMINATION DEADLINE:

6 FEB 2026**Synopsis:**

This course will equip participants with the knowledge and skills required to drive progress against the backdrop of climate impacts, changing economies, ecological and social systems to build a resilient and sustainable city.

Participant Profile:

Mid- to senior-level government officials involved in policymaking and planning urban and smart city developments.

Topics:

- Integrated master planning and development
- Liveability Framework and Singapore's strategies towards liveability
- Urban governance principles and application in sectoral domains of urbanisation (environmental sustainability, water resource management, climate action, transport and housing)



Integrated Waste Management for Circular Economy



COURSE DATES:

NOMINATION DEADLINE:

13 MAR 2026**Synopsis:**

This course will address environmentally sustainable development, focusing on circular economy principles and integrated solid waste management strategies. It will explore policy, planning, practice, and innovation to advance circular materials management approaches that optimise resource efficiency, recovery, and reuse for socio-economic and ecological benefits at local and regional levels.

Participant Profile:

Mid- to senior-level government officials involved in integrated waste management, environmental conservation and sustainability.

Topics:

- Circular materials management approaches: waste to energy/resources
- Circular economy, its linkages and impact on smart cities development
- Tools and resources to address solid waste and plastic pollution

Introduction to National Heat Resilience Planning

Synopsis: This course will provide an introduction to key aspects of adaptation policy. It focuses on heat resilience, including its impacts, policy, technological, and nature-based solutions.

Participant Profile: Mid- to senior-level government officials involved in policymaking for sustainability and the environment.

- Introduction to urban heat challenges
- Measuring and modelling urban heat and interventions

Adaptation Policy & Nature-based Solutions

Synopsis: This course will provide an introduction to adaptation policymaking, including the use of climate science to assess climate risks, integrating risk assessments into planning, development of national adaptation plans and monitoring and implementation measures. It will also provide an overview of nature-based solutions (NbS), challenges facing conservation of natural sinks, and measures promoting nature conservation as part of both climate policy and business practice.

Participant Profile: Mid- to senior-level government officials involved in policymaking for sustainability and the environment.

- Basics of climate adaptation
- Climate modelling and downscaling for impact assessment
- Integrating climate risk into planning and developing National Adaptation Plans

Climate Resilience in Food Security

This course will provide insights into the intersection between food security and transboundary climate risks, and how countries can collaborate to reduce the knock-on impacts of climate change on our collective food security. It will further explore the enablers for climate-resilient agriculture including technological innovations, financing tools, and private sector's involvement.

Participant Profile:

Mid- to senior-level government officials involved in climate change and food security policy.

Topics:

- Transboundary climate risks affecting food systems
- Policy frameworks for regional food resilience cooperation
- Multi-sector adaptation partnerships and financing
- Risk assessment, monitoring, and data sharing tools
- Stakeholder engagement and conflict resolution
- Climate-smart agriculture and agritech innovations
- Blended finance principles for agricultural adaptation
- Private capital engagement: incentives, risk mitigation and impact measurement

Carbon Markets: Implementing Article 6 of the Paris Agreement

NOMINATION DEADLINE:

25 SEP 2026**Synopsis:**

This course will explore how nations can implement the comprehensive requirements of Article 6 of the Paris Agreement effectively and realistically.

Participant Profile:

Mid- to senior-level government officials involved in policymaking for sustainability and the environment.

Topics:

- Understanding of Article 6 of the Paris Agreement, with an emphasis on 6.2
- Potential benefits of Article 6 and interaction with the countries' Nationally Determined Contributions
- Identification of eligible projects under Article 6
- Carbon registries and tracking to align with Article 6 reporting and accounting
- Regulatory and legislative best practices for environmental integrity standards and assessments



Introduction to National Climate Targets



COURSE DATES:

11 - 15 JAN 2027

NOMINATION DEADLINE:

6 NOV 2026**Synopsis:**

This course will provide an introduction to the process of developing Long-term Low Emissions Development Strategies (LT-LEDS), Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs), and Biennial Transparency Reports (BTRs), which are key policy documents guiding climate policy development, implementation and reporting in line with the Paris Agreement.

Participant Profile:

Mid- to senior-level government officials involved in policymaking for sustainability and the environment.

Topics:

- Introduction to LT-LEDS, NDCs and BTR process
- Greenhouse gas measurement and accounting
- Assessment of mitigation potentials and downscaling to sectoral targets
- Enabling policies (e.g., carbon tax)
- Financial, energy and emissions modelling and cost benefit analysis



Green Financing and Sustainable Investments



COURSE DATES:

1 - 5 FEB 2027

NOMINATION DEADLINE:

27 NOV 2026**Synopsis:**

This course will provide an overview of green financing, emphasising the role of financial instruments and policy frameworks in supporting environmentally sustainable projects. It will also explore mechanisms to mobilise capital for green initiatives and assess associated risks.

Mid- to senior-level government officials involved in policymaking for sustainability and the environment.

Topics:

- Introduction to green financing
- Green financial instruments
- Regulatory frameworks
- Risk management in green financing

Sustainable Financing of Cities

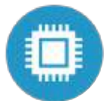

Synopsis: This course will provide insights on the developments of Fintech and its adoption, and how to meet the regulatory challenges for sustaining a Fintech environment that balances Fintech benefits with risks management.

Singapore is one of the busiest ports in the world and the largest transshipment hub globally. Tuas Port will handle 65 million Twenty-foot Equivalent Units (TEUs) when fully completed in the 2040s, making it the world's largest automated port.



Macroeconomic and Financial Management

Given the increasingly complex economic and policy challenges faced by governments around the world, Singapore partners with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to deliver programmes on macroeconomic and financial management and emerging issues such as climate change, digitalisation, and nowcasting. These courses are conducted at the IMF-Singapore Regional Training Institute (STI), which was established in 1998 and serves as the IMF's Asia-Pacific training centre. With over 30 annual programmes, the STI has conducted more than 700 courses for over 21,000 participants from 38 countries.

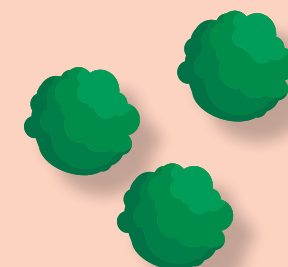
